5. The HS had its PAASCU re-accreditation last November 26-27, 2007. The school passed the accreditation and is given 5 years. This means that the next re-accreditation will be done in 2013.
6. The La Salle Academy Alumni Association (LSAAA) is continually serving its alumni and the school. This has been done through its various activities such as the following:
  - 6.1 "Green Card." – This is the alumni association official identification card making all its members authentic Lasallians. This will allow the holder entrance to the school and use some of its facilities subject to the existing school's guidelines as to its use. This is aside from discounts at different accredited establishments and/or professional services. However, the green card doesn't excuse an alumnus/alumna from the guard's asking of his/her purpose as part of our SOPs. Alumni are expected to abide by our school rules and regulations helping the school develop positive values and attitudes among our students.
